Classroom Management Plan Reflections

The end of the school year is the perfect time to reflect, review, and even modify your Classroom Management Plan.

Consider the following questions and recommendations:

Attention Signal: *Does your signal gain attention from students within 5 seconds? If not..*

- Change or reteach your signal. Be sure students understand the 5 second goal.
- Pause and collect eye contact from students. Use nonverbal signals.
- Consistently provide positive feedback and acknowledge students who quickly follow your signal.

Expectations during Activities and Transitions: Are students meeting your expectations? If not..

- Ensure your CHAMPS expectations clearly define what activities and transitions should look and sound like. Practice and post your expectations before activities and transitions, especially those that are problematic.
- Set a goal for how long activities/transitions should take- use a countdown, timer, or song.

Classroom Environment: *Does your classroom climate feel positive and engaging? If not..*

- Make a list of non-contingent interactions to implement regularly (greet students at the door, sanctioned "chit-chat," and positive notes, etc.).
- Increase your use of positive feedback (academic, effort, and social).
- Increase your use of intermittent celebrations.
- Consider setting a class-wide goal tied to an incentive.
